Current Cases in Humboldt County

- 50 total confirmed cases
 - 23 of cases had contact with a known case
 - 18 of cases had traveled internationally
 - 6 of the cases were community transmission
- 3 cases were hospitalized

Current Cases at K'ima:w Medical Center

- 1 Positive case
- 11 patients have been tested and they have come back negative
- 5 tests are pending

COVID-19 Response Team Update

Updates from our team:

- Stay-at-home order is active in Hoopa, CA
 - Curfew times are 8 PM to 4 AM
 - Fines for violating curfew are \$500, \$1,000, and \$1,500 for the first, second, and third offenses, respectively.
- We are highly encouraging people to stay home unless people need to do essential travel for things like food, medicine, or other necessary items.
 - If you need to travel for any reason, please [practice social distancing](#) and maintain approximately six (6) feet away from other people.
 - If you are sick, we want to emphasize that people need to [wear facemasks](#) when they're around other people.
 - Please clean your hands often by using soap and water for over 20 seconds, or use [hand sanitizer](#) with over 60 percent alcohol.

Groceries

Hoopa Grocery Store

- Delivery available Monday through Friday to **ALL COMMUNITY ELDERS** (ages 65 and over) for groceries.
 - Please call the Hoopa Grocery Store at **(530) 625-1013**
 - Orders placed before 3 PM will have same-day delivery, if supplies are in stock.
 - Orders must be over \$20, through cash or check only.
- Preferred elder's shopping hours are 6 AM - 8 AM.

TCCC

- Will be delivering a food box to **ALL COMMUNITY ELDERS** (ages 65 and over) in the next several days.

Firewood

- A free 1/2 cord of firewood can be ordered for community elders (ages 65 and over) in the community

Community Updates

Hoopa Grocery Store

- Hours are changing to 6 AM to 7 PM.
- They have assigned an employee dedicated to sanitization of the store
- Limit to 1 package of toilet paper, 1 case of water, and 1 hand sanitizer per customer.
 - Toilet paper is out of stock, but the staff is regularly seeking new supplies.
- Occupancy is limited to 10 shoppers in the store.
 - After 2 people exit the store, they will allow 2 people in.

Hoopa Mini Mart

- The new Hoopa Mini-Mart hours are:
 - **7 AM to 10 AM** (OPEN),
 - **10 AM to 12 PM** (Gas ONLY, while employees sanitize store),
 - **12 PM to 2 PM** (OPEN),

- **2 PM to 5 PM** (Gas ONLY, while employees sanitize store),
- **5 PM to 7 PM** (OPEN)
- Hoopa Mini-Mart will also be implementing a **\$5 minimum** purchase
- Occupancy is limited to 3 shoppers in the store.
- Gas is pumped by the staff, and the preferred payment method is debit/credit card.

- HVPUD District Office is open Monday, Wednesday, Friday 8 AM to 12 PM
